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BICULTURAL FOOTSTEPS

Aotearoa is a bicultural country where the many cultures who call this country home can be understood as Tangata Whenua (people of the land) and Taiuiwi (all other cultures).

Youthline's Bicultural Footsteps programme explores biculturalism through a Marae Wananga – or live in weekend at Te Puea Marae in Mangere. This is the third stage of Youthline's training to work with young people.

You can connect with your Youthline whanau and build cultural competency through learning, reflection, sharing, kai, waiata and fun. It may also be a space to reflect on where you have come from, your tupuna (ancestors); the taonga (treasures) they have given you and how you can use these to support taiohi (young people).

Don't worry if you've never been on a Marae before or think you don't know what to do. Trained facilitators will help you prepare for the Marae and support people are available over the weekend.
